10. CWCB/MRT Policies on Funding Aging Infrastructure Projects (L. Darling & Jeff Rodriguez – 25 min.)

A new version of the Statewide water plan has a new bucket for aging infrastructure and drought resilience. The Statewide Fund is one fund, not two categories within the program. CWCB funds for aging infrastructure do not generally fall under CWP grants. These types of projects might fall under a CWP grant, but it must show multiple benefits. Money received as matching funds that are not CWCB funds can be used as matching funds including federal monies.
